
LEARNING IN FAMILIES TOGETHER (LIFT)

IN TASMANIAN GOVERNMENT SCHOOLS



Did you know?

Scottsdale Primary School is part of the Learning in Families Together (LIFT) programme. It is aimed at encouraging and supporting family engagement with your child's literacy and numeracy learning at home. LIFT values you as your child's first and continuing teacher and provides opportunities for you to be actively involved in your child's learning. It is aimed for families with children in kindergarten to year 2 and supports the LIL (Launching into Learning) programme which is for children 0 – 4 years.

Look out for:

Over the next few weeks children from Kinder to Grade 2 will be able to take home a 'LIFT Bag' that contains a game or books to share and play with your child. Our first focus is the Talking that Matters programme, and we will provide some information and activities on Newsletters and posters around the school to help prompt you with some ideas about how you can support and engage with your children.
